President's Message ~ January/February 2024

n this issue, we celebrate the winners of the 29th running of the National Championships and Field Trial. Whatever you do with your Gordons, whether hunting, competing, or just sitting by the fire with your pet, we are grateful for our involvement with this versatile, multi-talented breed.

Our members have again been receiving phishing and spam emails purportedly from me or from other GSCA members. We have sent an email blast out to you all with information on how to verify the legitimacy of emails from the Board and other GSCA members and how to best protect yourself. The most important thing to remember is to never reply or click on a link in a suspect email. Please respond only by phone or by sending a new email to the relevant party using their email address in the Member's Handbook. No Board member will ever ask you to buy gift cards. If an email asks you to reply, PLEASE don't reply or click on anything. Call us or send us a new email. This will best protect you.

Our website is undergoing many terrific improvements. It is extremely important that the website contains complete information on all upcoming GSCA events. We've had many reports of folks trying to find event information that hasn't been submitted to our official site. If a National Event has its own website or Facebook page, it should also have a link to **gsca.org** and conversely, the event chair should be sure that the website is provided with a link to the event site or Facebook page. Please send all information to webmaster, Donnah Brnger at **Webmaster@gsca.org**, so she can post it to the website with the event information.

Following the publication of a proposal and request for member input by Bill Dargay, Annual Awards Chair, to reduce the number of conformation awards from ten to four for each category, the membership responded unanimously to the proposal to reduce the number of awards from ten to four. The Board elected to reduce the Bench and Breed awards to four, but to retain the ten awards for the Owner/Handler category, starting with the 2024 awards year.

I am saddened to report that long time member Bob Deller passed as a result of a tragic fall on ice. Bob joined GSCA, with his wife Gail, in 1994 and they bred Gordons under the *Shiloh* prefix, producing multi-titled Gordon Setters, with an emphasis on Agility competitors, as well as loved family companions.

I must also sadly report that we lost Tom Olson this week. He belonged to GSCA, along with his wife, Deborah, for more than than 45 years and served as Vice President and President of the GSCA from 1984-1989. He bred Gordon Setters under the *MacAlder* prefix with Charles (Chuck) Stephenson, who founded MacAlder Gordon Setters. After Chuck's death, Tom carried on the MacAlder line, breeding many champions, including Best in Show dogs. He was an avid hunter and the kennel produced many hunting companions.

Long time former member, Bob Showers passed on January 8th after a long illness. He is survived by wife, Winifred "Fred" Lloyd-Smith, of Vanessa, Ontario and his five children. Bob and Fred have been part of our Gordon Setter community for many years. Bob will be missed. Donations may be made to the American Diabetes Association or the Alzheimer's Society.

2024 Nodrog Health Clinic

It's been almost 30 years since we did our first Nodrog Health Clinic and we're pleased to report we'll be doing another this spring. The 2024 Nodrog Gordon Setter Club of Michigan Health Clinic will be **Sunday, May 19, 2024**. To the best of our knowledge, we are the oldest Gordon Setter health clinic in

the U.S. having held our first clinic in 1986. Ophthalmologist Gretchen Schmidt, DVM comes in from Wisconsin to do OFA (CAER) eye examinations. Dr. Schmidt's been with us since the beginning and we believe she's examined the eyes of more Gordon Setters than any other veterinarian in the U.S.

The clinic will be held at Dr. Barb Meining's Red Cedar Animal Hospital in Okemos, Michigan, east of Lansing, Michigan. In addition to eye examinations by Dr. Schmidt, Dr. Barb will do thyroid testing, patellar luxation exams, dentition exams, heartworm testing (4DX tests) and microchipping. Dr. Meining may be able to perform additional veterinary outpatient services upon prior request. All testing is by advance reservation only.

Deadline for reservations is **Wednesday, May 15**. A flyer, with the reservation form and complete pricing information, will be available in mid-February. By the time you receive this issue of the *News*, the information will be posted on the OFA website (ofa.org)—click on the health clinics tab on the main page. Check-in is at 7:30 a.m., with first eye exams starting at 8:00. Last eye exams will be done 'around' 11:30.

Annual eye examinations should be part of every Gordon owner's 'routine maintenance' for their dogs. Eye problems that may not be detected by the owner (or on routine visits to a general practitioner) may signal an underlying health problem that can be treated before it becomes serious. Annual eye checks are not just for those breeding dogs. Our own experience and stories from those who attend the clinic support the idea that an annual eye examination is one of the building blocks of good health for your dog.

So, if you are close enough to Okemos, Michigan (just east of Lansing and with easy access from I-96), come join us on May 19. This is an all-breed eye clinic and services are provided to non-purebreds as well. Dr. Schmidt can handle 90 exams in the time allotted. If you have friends with other breeds who live in commuting distance to Lansing, we would be happy to send them a clinic flyer or other information—just send me the name, address, phone number and email contact info. If you aren't near enough to attend our clinic but are interested in participating in or organizing a clinic in your area, get in touch with me at Dianne Avery, PO Box 824, Brooklyn, MI 49230-0824 or wyttsend2@gmail.com / 517/592-5929 (8 am to 8 pm, ET).

2024 Midwest Specialties

2024 will be an exciting year for Gordon Setter lovers as we celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Gordon Setter Club of America. It's a big year for the GSCA Midwest Event Committee as well as it marks the 70th anniversary of this show, the oldest Gordon Setter specialty in the U.S. We usually do two shows in one day but we have some special things planned and we'll be doing the shows at a more leisurely pace. We will hold one show on Friday, and the other on Saturday so folks will have time to socialize. The location for the specialties is the Lima Kennel Club Show grounds, Lima, Ohio.

The shows will be held Friday, May 10 and Saturday, May 11. Puppy Sweeps and Veteran Sweeps on Friday will be judged by Richard (Rich) Black of Elsie, Michigan. Rich and his wife Kathy have owned Gordon Setters for more than four decades and breed under the *Stilmoor* prefix. They have handled their

own dogs and mentored several generations of Junior handlers. Breed classes and Junior Showmanship will be judged by Dr. Ronald Spritzer of Milford, Ohio. We will have a later judging start time for the Friday show as some folks may be driving in on Friday morning.

Saturday's judging panel will be Elliot Weiss, Novelty, Ohio, who will preside over Juniors and Breed classes. Mr. Weiss has judged for many years and has a special fondness for setters. Both breed judges expressed their pleasure at being invited to judge. Judging Puppy and Veteran Sweeps on Saturday is Delores (Dee) Vayda of Hudson, Michigan. Dee bred Gordon Setters for a number of years under the Shojin prefix and she and her husband Ron now breed, exhibit and compete in conformation and performance sports with their Whippets. Judging will start earlier on Saturday so we can finish earlier, as Westminster Kennel Club has moved their 2024 date to just a few days after our specialty. We know those exhibiting at that event will want to get on the road as soon as possible. There are also all-breed shows in eastern Ohio, and GSCA will support the entry at the Sunday show. Dana Cline will judge Gordons at the show, Anne Savory Bolus judges the Sporting Group and Cindy Meyer does Best in Show.

Those of you who have been to our Lima site know it is a great location for a spring show in Ohio, although the weather is always unpredictable. The show is held outdoors but the ring is adjacent to a large open-air pavilion and, if it rains (always a possibility), we can simply move the ring under cover. There is lots of room for grooming and crating under the pavilion. Electric hookups are available for a reasonable fee. For those traveling, you may camp at the grounds on Thursday evening or stay at one of the local dog friendly hotels. The host hotel is offering a special rate and that information will be in the premium list.

We share the site with Labrador Retriever Specialties. They will hold shows on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Midwest Committee members will be at the site on Thursday afternoon to rope off our rings and grooming area. Last year the Lab folks offered health testing. We believe Gordon Setter folks can participate if they wish. More information on the availability of health testing at the site will be published in our premium list. Because this is a 'special' specialty, we will be holding an on-site catered dinner after the Friday show. Details on this to be posted in the premium list.

We will hold our raffle of some nice dog-related items. Proceeds are divided between the Gordon Setter Donor Advised Fund at AKC/CHF and our GSCA Midwest account, designated for our rescue efforts. We are also expecting vendors at this show, and the GSCA 2024 National Specialty Committee will have fundraising items available. Donations to the raffle are gratefully accepted (contact me). For vendors not associated with a GSCA event, tables are inexpensive (\$10) but you must provide your own table covering. Contact show chair Jim Thacker if you would like us to reserve table(s). GSCA Midwest Treasurer Beni Levi happily accepts your donations to our trophy fund. Katie Marr heads up the Trophy Committee and we know she'll have some great stuff planned. 2024 GSCA National Specialty Marshall, Michigan

September 15-21, 2024

Host Hotel ~ Hampton Inn Marshall, Michigan,

The 2024 National Specialty & Companion Events Committees want to bring you the most up-to-date news regarding GSCA's 100th Birthday Party to be held September 15-21, 2024, with accurate and timely information on the events without repeating ourselves. In response to the article on the 2024 National Specialty that ran in the December 2023 issue, we've already received inquiries. We answer them in this article, as well as bring you any new information.

Hotel Reservations. The host hotel, **Hampton Inn Marshall, Michigan**, began accepting reservations on December 1, 2023 and the hotel has received a number of reservations at press time. If you are planning to attend, it's a good idea to make your reservation now. Rate at the Hampton is \$139 + tax. Pets are allowed for \$50 per dog. This is a flat fee whether you stay one night or more. If you plan to have more than two dogs in the room, please check with the hotel. Dogs left alone in the room must be crated. Make your reservations with the hotel directly by calling 269-789-0131. To get the group rate, you must mention Gordon Setter Club of America. The group rate code is GSC.

Other lodging in the area? There are other hotels in the area but the Hampton had the best rate which also allowed dogs. If you will be traveling without pets, there are some other options available, although Marshall, a small town, stays busy with tourist traffic from spring to late fall. Many of the hotels in the immediate area are already fully booked for our dates but we will be happy to provide the names of some that may still have some available rooms. Let us know if you would like a list.

Camping. If you plan to camp, we expect you will camp at the show site, the Calhoun County Fairgrounds. Camping rate per night is \$45 and includes water and electric. We did check into alternate nearby campsites but most are not accepting reservations at this time and some are accepting only monthly reservations.

In Scent Work, It is the Canine Who is the Star of the Showl

cent Work is an adventure for you and your Gordon. I was looking for an activity I could do with my 6 year old bitch, *Faith* (CH Halcyon Fleetwing Semper Fi SWAE SWE), formerly owned by GSCA member Jane Matteson. I adopted Faith after Jane passed. We first attended an obedience class where the instructor was talking about other classes, including Scent Work, that were being offered. Thinking that Scent Work was something Faith would enjoy, I started taking her to those classes where, it turned out, she was a natural but I was not!

I then started to volunteer at Scent Work trials, both AKC and NACSW (National Association of Canine Scent Work) to see how a trial was run. I watched the owner-handlers to learn their techniques in running their dogs.

In Scent Work (also referred to as Nose Work), a dog must use its nose to search out hidden odors, and then alert

its handler when the odors are detected. It requires that a dog find anywhere from one to multiple 'hides' that are hidden inside and/or outside various places in a controlled area. The 'hides' are cotton swabs saturated with essential oils of Birch, Anise, and Clove. AKC also uses Cypress. Neither the dog nor the handler knows where these "target" odors are hidden.

I was fortunate that Faith was not only a slow-moving, thorough nose work dog but very motivated by receiving treats after she found the hide. We spent many weekends travelling around southern California to attend the Scent Work trials offered by various all-breed and specialty clubs. Faith loved going to the trials and loved the strong partnership we developed. Faith achieved Advance Elite (NACSW title) and Scent Work Excellent and Scent Work Exterior Excellent (AKC) levels of Scent Work. Even as she aged and had some difficulty climbing stairs, the excitement of being in a trial made her forget about any disability.

Unfortunately the Pandemic put a halt to all Nose Work trials (as well as all other performance events) for almost 2 years and we missed the opportunity for advancing to higher levels. Faith was 12 when she passed but was still doing her Nose Work at 11! The beauty and fun of Nose Work is that it is not age-restrictive for either the dog or the handler and there is little physical activity required. There isn't any direct competition against other dogs required to achieve the various levels of Scent Work titles. You work as a team with your Gordon to find what is required at each level within a set time limit. After you have trialed for a while, you will understand the statement 'trust your dog' because your dog knows where to look but we, the handlers, get in the way.

I now am trialing my 12 year old male Gordon, *Baloo* (Halcyon Xo CGCA), and my 3 year old bitch, *Luna* (CH Corisande By The Light Of The Moon Of Kendelee SWN) who both love the adventure of the search and excitement of finding the hides.

I encourage everyone to look into finding a Scent Work class and giving it a try. You will never look back and your Gordon will thank you for the adventure.

GSCA 2022 Annual Awards Procedural Reference Guide

This guide pertains to achievements in calendar year 2023.

Award winners will be published in the June, 2024 Gordon Setter News

There have been multiple changes in the GSCA Annual Awards that became effective with the 2022 Awards Year. Those changes have been bolded within this annual Awards Reference Guide.

The owner of a candidate for an Annual Award must be a GSCA member in good standing as of the month of December, 2023.

To minimize potential mix-ups in placement awards, an Awards Committee member will send a points verification form (after the tabulations have been made) to any member who may be eligible for awards placements. The form will ask the member to verify the point count the Committee has tabulated. If there are corrections to be made, these must be sent to the Awards Committee member by April 15, 2024. Failure to respond by the April 15th deadline means the Committee's tabulation will stand. Please direct any questions to the Awards Committee member whose name appears at the end of each award category.

BEAUTY, BRAINS, AND BIRDSENSE AWARD

This award is no longer automatic. Owner (GSCA member in good standing as of December, 2023) must apply for this award by March 1, 2024 and provide the Annual Awards Chair with the three qualifying titles and the dates on which each was earned (Motion 2022-69).

The designation "Owner-Handled" will be added to the engraved plate on the marble paperweight award if the owner handled the Gordon for all points in the conformation Championship title, all qualifying legs in the "brains" qualifying titles, and all qualifying legs in the "birdsense" qualifying title. Handler must be listed as owner or co-owner on the AKC ownership registration PRIOR to achieving the titles.

Virtually earned AKC titles in 2023 do not qualify for this or any other GSCA award (Motion 2022-72).

To qualify under all three categories for this award, the Gordon Setter, owned or co-owned by a GSCA member in good standing, must have at least one of the following AKC or GSCA titles (or higher) in each of the Beauty, Brains & Birdsense categories. Two of the three qualifying titles can have been earned in prior years as long as the third qualifying title was earned in 2023:

Beauty: Champion (CH)

Brains: Obedience Companion Dog (CD); Rally Advanced (RA), Tracking (TD), Novice Agility (NA), Open Agility Preferred (OAP); Scent Work Advanced (SWA)

Please note: The following previously qualifying titles—Graduate Novice (GN), Graduate Open (GN), and Versatility (VCD)—are no longer qualifiers.

Birdsense: Junior Hunter (JH); Senior Hunter (SH); Master Hunter (MH); Field Champion (FC); Amateur Field Champion (AFC); National Field Champion (NFC); National Amateur Field Champion (NAFC); National Walking Gun Dog Champion (NWGDC), GSCA Working Dog (WD) or GSCA Working Dog Retrieve (WDR). If your dog's field title is a Working Dog or Working Dog Retrieve, please send Bill Dargay copies of your three 'pass' certificates.

Bench Gordon Setter of the Year. Effective January 1, 2021 (Board motion #20-029), Bench Gordon of the Year is awarded to the Gordon Setter accumulating the highest number of points from ALL dogs defeated at both All-Breed shows (even if the BOB Gordon did not go on to take a group placement) and independent specialties (sometimes referred to as Overall) as ranked by the AKC "Setters (Gordon) AKC TopDogssm Using All-Breed Totals" report. Ten placements are awarded.

Breed Gordon Setter of the Year. Awarded to the Gordon Setter winning Best of Breed over the largest number of Gordons in AKC point shows. The winners in this category are determined using the AKC "Breed" report which includes Gordon Setters defeated at both AKC all-breed shows and AKC independent specialty shows. Ten placements are awarded.

Owner Handled Gordon Setter of the Year. Awarded to the top ten Gordons ranked in the AKC National Owner Handler Series. There is no need to apply for this award as the AKC reports are sent directly to the Awards Chair, who will notify owners of dogs receiving placements. Points are tracked by AKC for the AKC Invitational, with rankings compiled during AKC's qualifying period. The qualifying period is subject to change on an annual basis by the AKC but is always published in the Gordon Setter News along with the quarterly NOHS rankings. For the 2023 awards year, the qualifying period was September 22, 2022-September 21, 2023. The AKC report includes points earned by Gordon Setters who are owner-handled, as provided by the AKC National Owner-Handled Series Point Scale. AKC National Owner-Handled Series points do not contribute to championship points. At an individual show, a dog earns the cumulative number of AKC National Owner-Handled Series points associated with each placement.

For the 3 categories of Conformation awards: Ten placements in each category are automatically awarded. A plaque will be awarded to the first place winner in each category and certificates will be awarded to 2nd through 10th place winners. Placements in each category are automatically awarded to members in good standing as of December, 2023.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP

Junior of the Year. Presented to the Club member accumulating the highest number of points while showing a Gordon in Junior Showmanship competition during the calendar year. One point will be awarded for each dog/handler team defeated. Only wins earned while the applicant was a member in good standing of the Club can be counted. Juniors <u>must apply</u> for the annual award by providing their name, show where award was won, date of show, placement and class entered. Four placements will be awarded in this category. DUAL PURPOSE GORDON SETTER OF THE YEAR

Dual Purpose Gordon Setter of the Year recognizes the top five Gordon Setters representing the epitome of our breed's standard—a recognized contender in both the show ring and the field. The initial criteria required for a Gordon to compete for this annual award is having earned both a show championship title (100 points) plus at least one of the following titles: Senior Hunter (100 pts), Master Hunter (150 pts), Field Championship (200 pts), or Amateur Field Championship (200 pts). The year in which the second of the above qualifying titles is earned (beginning with the calendar year 2016), is the year in which the Gordon begins eligibility for one of the Dual Purpose Gordon placements. Placement at the National Championship or the National Amateur Field Championship counts towards points, but does not qualify a dog for award eligibility who is not also a FC or AFC. All Gordon Setters who have earned the title qualifications as stated above then continue to earn points in any of the following ways:

Grand Champion points earned during the Awards year

Continued conformation group placement/BIS qualifying points (*motion 20-049*) for the following:

Group 4: 4 points
Group 3: 6 points
Group 2: 8 points
Group 1: 10 points
Best in Show: 25 points

→ AKC field trial placements (number of dogs defeated), or

Continued qualifying passes at the Senior Hunter (5 pts) or Master Hunter (10 pts) test levels. Only points accrued in a calendar year are considered for the annual award, and a dog must have earned points beyond the basic eligibility criteria (i.e., qualifying titles) to be in contention.

Awards will be given to the top five dual purpose Gordon Setters. A plaque will be awarded to the first place dog, and certificates will be awarded to 2nd through 5th place.

Placements in each category are automatically awarded to members in good standing as of December, 2023. Consecutive ownership of a dog by members who are members throughout their period of ownership is acceptable. There is no need to apply for this award as the AKC statistics are sent directly to the Awards Chair, who will notify owners of dogs receiving placements to verify point totals. However, contact Rhonda if your Gordon holds the above qualifying titles so that it is not inadvertently missed in the end of year points' calculations (new titles are not always promptly recorded by AKC and occasional errors do occur in AKC reporting).

GSCA members who own either a Dual Champion or Show Champion with a Senior Hunter, Master Hunter or Amateur Field Champion title that is still competing in any of the three venues (conformation, field trials or hunting tests) should forward the dog's name to Rhonda Cornum at the beginning of each calendar year in which it is still competing so that results can be tabulated at the end of each award year.

High Scoring Novice, Open, and Agility Excellent Awards will be determined by the first three qualifying scores at each level, regardless of the year(s) in which they were earned as long as the third qualifying score was earned within 2023. These are automatic awards, with four placements. Ties will be broken by the dog with the most yards per second (Motions 2022-25/2022-66).

Master Agility Excellent Awards will be determined by the first ten qualifying scores. Ties will be broken by the dog with the most yards per second.

Advanced Agility Dog Award recognizes the Gordon Setters with the most Double Qs and MACH combined points for the year. Points are earned from January 1st thru December 31st of the award year. On January 1st of each year all Master level dogs start at zero. Only the points earned during the current calendar year count toward this annual award. All Gordon Setters earning at least 1 MACH point during the current calendar year are eligible. Earning a title that year is not a requirement. This award does not include PACH points. AKC calculates the overall award by giving bonus points (10 per Double Q) and adding that to the speed points earned. This "bonus" ensures both speed and consistency are rewarded, which is consistent with AKC's philosophy. Ties will be broken by the dog with the most yards per second.

In each Agility category, 1st place is awarded a plaque and 2nd thru 4th place are awarded certificates.

High Scoring Novice, Open, and Utility Dog Awards will be determined by the first three qualifying scores at each level, regardless of the year(s) in which they were earned, as long as the third qualifying score falls within 2023. These are automatic awards, with four placements.

High Scoring Advanced Obedience Dog is based on points tabulated using the First and Foremost system in Open and/or Utility, for dogs who have previously attained a title at that level of obedience. Example: A dog earned its CDX title in Open A on 11/11/23. On 11/12/23 that dog had a qualifying score in Open A. The November 12 score will count toward the Advanced Obedience Dog Award. This is an automatic award, with four placements.

In each of the above obedience categories, 1st place is awarded a plaque and 2nd thru 4th place are awarded certificates.

Black & Tan Obedience Award goes to the Gordon Setter with the highest average score using the top five scores achieved that year. Each Gordon Setter earning at least five obedience qualifying scores will automatically be considered for this award. These scores can be from any level of obedience (Novice, Open or Utility). The winner of this award receives an unframed print and engraved name plate. Repeat winners of this award may opt out of an additional print and receive an additional engraved name plate.

NEW HORIZONS AWARD

The New Horizons Award was created to encourage GSCA members to "try something new" with their Gordon Setter(s) and increase entries in AKC obedience and rally sports. This is a handler award, not a Gordon Setter achievement award. This award will encourage members who have little or no experience in these sports to discover the fun and rewards of competing in AKC events. This award will also recognize seasoned obedience/rally handler-members who are new to the Gordon Setter breed and handle a Gordon to any or all of these titles for the first time. A candidate for this award must be a GSCA member in good standing as of December of the Awards year, who handles to achieve their first Rally Novice ("RN"), Rally Advanced ("RA"), Rally Excellent ("RE"), Obedience Beginner Novice ("BN"), Obedience Novice ("CD") and/or

Utility title ("UD") from either the "A" or "B" classes on a Gordon Setter. A handler can win the New Horizons Award up to 7 times—once for each of the qualifying titles achieved by a Gordon. The New Horizons Award must be applied for by the handler. The award became effective in the 2020 Awards year. Qualifying applicants for this award must apply by providing the following information to the New Horizons Award tabulator (contact information below) no later than April 1 of the year following the qualification period (i.e., the awards calendar year). Award winners will receive a certificate of achievement, a listing in the annual awards issue of the newsletter, and the opportunity for the handler to tell his/her story about the journey undertaken to reach a new title. This article will be published in the newsletter's obedience column.

RALLY AWARDS

High Scoring Rally Advanced has been added to the annual Rally awards and is based on the first three qualifying scores at the Rally Advanced level regardless of the year(s) in which they were earned as long as the third qualifying score falls within 2023. This is an automatic award with four placements. First place will receive a plaque, and placements 2-4 will receive a certificate.

High Scoring Rally Excellent Obedience Dog is based on the first three qualifying scores at the *Rally Excellent level* regardless of the year(s) in which they were earned as long as the third qualifying score falls within 2023. These are automatic awards, with four placements.

PRODUCER AWARDS

Stud Dog of the Year &

Brood Bitch of the Year

These awards are automatic. The award is presented to a stud dog that produced three or more offspring finishing a qualifying championship title and to a brood bitch with two or more offspring finishing a qualifying championship title during the 2023 awards year.



Championship titles include AKC field (FC or AFC), Obedience (OTCH), Conformation (CH), Champion Tracker (CT), and agility (MACH). There are four placements for these awards.

Top Producer Awards

Presented to dogs with ten champion get* (AKC bench or performance) and bitches with six champion produce* (same criteria). Titles need not be earned in a single year. This is an automatic award. However, if there is any question that all get or produce have been recognized, please contact

*For producer awards, only one champion title per dog will be counted. For example, a dog that has earned both a conformation and field championship counts as only one champion produced by its parents.

GSCA FIELD TRIAL AWARDS

The GSCA will annually present the following field trial awards:

Gun Dog of The Year: For points earned in all open, amateur, limited or grand gun dog stakes; and all open, amateur, limited, or grand all age stakes; and shooting gun dog stakes sanctioned by the AKC.

Gun Dog (Retrieve): As above, but points must be earned in stakes requiring a retrieve to hand. Points in this category may be counted toward the Gun Dog award, but they will not be counted toward both.

Derby Dog of the Year: For points earned in open or amateur derby stakes.

Puppy of the Year: For points earned in open or amateur puppy stakes.

To receive an award, a dog must be owned or co-owned by a GSCA member in good standing **as of December**, 2023. Only those points earned while a member will count. The awards are made on a calendar-year basis. Four placements are given in each category. Rotating trophies are presented for first place in each category.

These awards are automatic. No application is necessary for points earned in AKC events. The Field Awards tabulator will calculate all AKC points.



As a reminder, only AKC sanctioned events will be counted towards GSCA annual awards (Motions 2022-06/2022-55). (Note: a full explanation of this decision was published in the September 2022 issue of the News.) Effective January 1, 2022, the number of dogs defeated in American Field or AFTCA (American Field Trial Clubs of America) events are no longer included when tallying points for GSCA annual field awards.

Points for all awards are calculated in the following manner:

1st place 5 x dogs defeated 2nd place 3 x dogs defeated 3rd place 2 x dogs defeated 4th place 1 x dogs defeated

Plaque Recognized Titles

The Title Achievement Awards Chair will review the monthly AKC Titleholder reports and keep a record of all plaque-recognized titles from the following qualifying list and supply that information to the Annual Awards Chair (who will then order the plaques at the same time as the annual performance award plaques). **The Board added the title of PACH (Preferred Agility Champion)** (Motion 2022-56) to the list of qualifying titles for plaques. If a Gordon earns both a MACH and a PACH title, only the first of the two titles earned will receive a plaque. Plaques will be awarded during the Club's Annual Awards banquet.

The prefix and suffix AKC titles now eligible for a plaque are as follows:

- a) AKC Dual Champion (DC)
- b) AKC Obedience Trial Champion (OTCH)
- c) AKC Utility Dog Excellent (UDX)
- d) AKC Champion Tracker (CT)
- e) AKC Master Agility Champion (MACH) or **AKC Preferred Agility Champion (PACH)** (the first of either an AKC MACH or PACH, but not both)

The Awards Committee can use your help! If your Gordon earned one of these titles in 2023, please contact Patti Brusk (medallionsgsca@gmail.com) and let her know the title and date earned so that none of these impressive titles are inadvertently overlooked!

Changes in Annual Awards Effective 2024

Effective with the Annual Awards year 2024, the number of placement awards for the top Bench Gordons of the Year [as ranked by the AKC "Setters (Gordon) TopDogssm Using All-Breed Totals" report] and top Breed Gordons of the Year (determined using the AKC "Breed" report) will be reduced from the top ten ranked to the top four.

The Owner Handled Gordon Setter of the Year (awarded to the top ten Gordons ranked in the AKC National Owner Handler Series) will continue to be awarded to the top ten placements.

But, blindingly stupid as the underlying non-proven notion of this bill is, what's worse is that it's so badly written, there is no definition of which breeds are "deformed and suffering" and it's very clear that this bill would enable a multiple number of breed exclusions in the future if the fools in the HSUSA decide, oh, I don't know, that Gordon's can't be owned in Phoenix because it's too hot for their black coat. Remember, these extremists want to ban all private ownership of animals; this is just another step along a dangerous path to hurt responsible breeder/owners.

The Danger of Sugarless Gum to Dogs

The following was posted on the AKC Delegate Chat list by the Leonberger breed delegate and he gave permission to share with other breed clubs.

"I think we all know the dangers of Xylitol, a substance found in sugarless gum, candy and even some peanut butter. Here's something everyone needs to be aware of. This is from a woman whose Lab ate half a pack of her daughter's sugar free gum.

As she headed for an emergency clinic, she was advised by the emergency vet to stop and get some sugar and administer it to the dog. When a dog ingests Xylitol, it causes the dog's sugar levels to tank, causing seizures and eventually death. She said the dog almost returned to normal after receiving the sugar. However, this is not a cure, but a stopgap measure to buy your dog some time. This is because, if not treated, the Xylitol will shortly attack the dog's liver, killing it within 2 days.

The bottom line is. Yes, administer sugar, but get to an emergency Vet as fast as you can. This information can save your dog. One piece of sugar free gum can be fatal to your dog."



Undescended Testicles (Monorchism - Cryptorchidism

The following appeared in Dr. Carmen Battaglia's Breeding Better Dogs In-the-Know-Newsletter and is reprinted here with permission

Research about breeders who have had puppies with undescended testicles have been studied for many years and most of the studies show that the failure of testicles to descend into the scrotum is a developmental defect involving the formation and correct location of the testes. Young and Willis reported on the many causes for this disorder including testicles that are too large or small, inguinal ring being too tight and a short peritone fold. Willis also noted that the inguinal ring can be too tight or too short leading to this problem. In a survey of 6,455 animals at American and Canadian veterinary schools, the incidence in canines regardless of breed was found to be only 0.4%. and that the condition tends to run in families. The low heritability of missing testicles is not limited to dogs, for pigs it is 3.2% and horses only 1.8% (Priester). The Symbols pedigree is also useful for these kinds of studies because it codes ancestors by gender. Males are shown as squares and females as circles. The advantage of the Symbols pedigree (below) is the fact that it includes the littermates of each ancestor. Colors are used to identify each disorder and dots are used to designate carriers.



A further study into this topic suggested that because the heritability of missing testicles is so low, there are likely to be other factors involved. A closer look at a puppies environment leads us to notice that rough play includes biting and jumping on each other can led to injuries.

These playful events can easily account for many injuries and bruises to the testicles. It is likely that puppies in large litters might be at a higher risk than those from smaller litters. Rough play on daily basis can easily account for the likelihood that injuries will increase.

A second environmental factor is the involvement of the 'eager breeder wants to know if their male is intact.' Regular and frequent attempts to hunt for these very tiny testicles oftentimes will result in the unintentional pinching and bruising one or both testicles. When this occurs, the body attempts to protect them from further injury by taking them back up. If the ring closes, the testicles cannot descend and the breeder is led to believe they were not there. This usually leads breeders to the place blame on the sire or another ancestor.

A recommendation that will lessen the probability of having missing testicles is twofold. 1. When pups begin rough play, distract them with toys and activities that change their focus to other things. 2. Breeders and owners should discontinue hunting for testicles until the pups are older or until the breeder and owner has to know. This will be sometime after a pup is 8-10 weeks of age when the testicles are easier to find. •

1/4/24—Blue Ridge Beef is expanding their recall to include additional lot numbers. This recall includes all lot numbers and used by dates between N24 1114 to N24 1224 of their 2 lb log of Kitten Grind UPC 8 54298 00101 6; 2lb log of Kitten Mix UPC 8 54298 00143 6 and their 2lb log of Puppy Mix UPC 8 54298 00169 6 due to contamination of Salmonella and Listeria monocytogenes. Salmonella and Listeria monocytogenes can affect animals eating the products and there is risk to humans from handling contaminated pet products, especially if they have not thoroughly washed their hands after having contact with the products or any surfaces exposed to these products. ❖



e're lucky to own this dog. Twice he has won a GSCA National Championship title. The first was in 2021 when he won the National Walking Gun Dog Championship, and now, in 2023, he has captured the National Field Championship. Twice before he has come very close at the NFC—third in 2020 and second in 2021. In 2018, he took first at the National Field Trial's Walking Gun Dog stake. And as a young dog, he was the GSCA Derby Dog of the Year.

This year's judges were Lisa Pollock of Lucas, Iowa, and Scott Johnson of Winfield, Kansas. I asked them why they chose Lucky over the others, and they collectively said, "He was always moving forward and solid on his bird work. He's a pleasure to watch." Style can be hard to describe on paper, but when you see it, you know it, and Lucky has style.

A "grand stake" is 60 minutes long and our National Grand Championship stake is run over the wide open spaces of Kansas—a place where the wind rarely stops—and this year the birds were a bit scarce. Great credit goes to Trena Cardwell who conditioned him for the event and skillfully handled him around the course, with assistance from scout Sara Job.

Lucky is from a 2015 litter of six by Milomix Earl (*Earl*) and out of Clearcut Crack That Whip (*Cracker*). Breeders Lynne Barnett and Matt Eder can be very proud of their matchmaking as three of the six hold impressive titles. Lucky's two titled littermates are NFC FC AFC Mvr Macfarlane Duke Of Earl (owned by Mary Ann Gustafson) and FC Mvr Macfarlane Earl's Pearl (owned by Lynne Barnett).

Lucky turns nine years of age in February and his field trial days are winding down, but his offspring look promising. At the National Championships, five of the Open Derby dogs were sired by Lucky. I own two, and they were first and second in GSCA's

2022 Puppy of the Year awards. I smile every time I think back to an Iowa trial where a well-known German Shorthaired Pointer (GSP) pro got beat by one of Lucky's kids. He grudgingly admitted, "That one has style."

The backstory

A few years back someone suggested I sign up for a FT program put on by a well-known GSP pro-handler who has a considerable following. I had been to trials where his students had swept the placements. How did I know they were his students? They all wore his kennel name tee-shirts/hats and their dogs' names indicated they had bought puppies from his kennel. The first time I went to his place, I met a woman who had flown in from Alaska to participate in the training, and she spoke very highly of him. Although he had never previously trained a Gordon Setter, he told me he was expanding his program and would accept my dog. I ended up purchasing only one of his three training videos, but didn't find it very helpful... and long story short, my dog flunked out.

Fast Forward

Fast forward to November 2022. Logistically, it made sense. There was a



field trial in Iowa put on by a GSP Club the weekend after the GSCA National Championships in Kansas, and it was a way to break up the long ride home to Minnesota. Also, I was in the hunt for my two Lucky puppies to win points and, with winter coming, there would be few future trials. Realistically, it was NOT ideal for Gordon Setters to place, let alone win.

As my Mother used to say, "Fools rush in where angels fear to tread." Well, Mom, I guess you were right this time, because wouldn't you know it, my eight month old Lucky girl (*Nellie*) was in the first brace with a GSP male handled by the aforementioned pro!

The Brace

The Open Puppy course started at a bottom of a hill. We were instructed to climb the hill and turn right and ride into a wide-open field where there was a large stand of trees a couple hundred yards out. The puppies strained at their collars and I noticed the GSP male was nearly double Nellie's size. He had a gleam in his eye that suggested he might be aggressive. Nellie

was in the lead, but turned left at the top of the hill and her would-be "suitor" followed in hot pursuit. I called her name to turn her and, as she slowed to turn around, he T-boned her. Nellie went flying and rolled a couple of times. I thought his handler would yell at his dog for being aggressive, but no, not a word. Off they went, and sure enough, he veered to get her again but she was off to the races.

As we walked our horses up the hill, I thought I would make conversation as we hadn't yet said a word to one another. I said, "You probably don't remember me, but I had a dog with you some years back." He replied, "I remember. No style."

There were four braces total, and I ran again in the third with my other Lucky puppy (*Duke*). All the other pups were GSPs. In fact, with the exception of Brittanys owned by one of the judges, all the dogs were GSPs.

Placements

Placements were announced at the end of the day. Open Puppy fourth place was called and it went to the GSP that my Duke had been braced with. Third went

to my Duke. Second went to the GSP pro and, as the first place ribbon was awarded to my girl Nellie, he somewhat grudgingly said, "Now that one has style!"

The icing on the cake came Sunday when Duke took first in Amateur Puppy, Nellie took second and six GSPs finished third – last. Nellie won her two Open Puppy points and Duke won his two Amateur Puppy points.

A hard way to win points

In closing, that was a hard way to win points. I prefer "Setter" FTs where there is more camaraderie. But, it's satisfying to know I can take my dogs to any FT and not only compete but also do well. Thank you, Lucky, for passing

along your style to a new generation of field bred Gordon Setters.

have had the privilege of owning and running some great dogs, FC AFC Tomar's Victory Renegade CD SH (Nike), NAFC Tomars Renegade Hot Attitude (Addy), and FC AFC Par's Light My Fire (Ricki). Although all those dogs earned various awards by the end of their careers, Rolex has already attained significant milestones and still has many years ahead of her. Rolex comes from the first litter of 8 puppies that Ricki had with Buck (2xNFC 3xNAFC GFC GAFC FC AFC ChuckarHill Buck Nekkid) and stood out amongst the litter from an early age. Her huge run (300-450 yards away), yet under control, and stylish point (tail straight up) made Puppy and Derby points happen with ease. For further training, Trena Cardwell worked with her, doing an expert job of getting her broke (steady to wing and shot) without the pressure of losing her lovely style. Thus, Rolex was ready to begin running in field trials as a broke dog.

She started to come into her own, accumulating 4 more points in additional to her 4 Puppy and Derby points. This gave her 9 points and only 1 needed to finish her Field Championship. In October of 2021 she had a flawless run in a 25-dog stake at the Nodrog field trial in Michigan and we finally finished the FC title.

At the GSCA National Amateur Field Championship in 2022, Rolex had a spectacular run, placing third, that was truly the thrill of my life. She lost first place to her litter brother *Penn* (now NAFC FC AFC Whitethorns Tahosa Penn), owned by my good friend, Mark Keegan. Well hey, it is all in the family. In that same year, she took fourth place (handled by Trena Cardwell) in the National Field Championship and littermate Penn took third.

Early in 2022 Rolex took a maternity leave and had 4 beautiful puppies. I kept two—*Ruthie* (Whitethorn's Ruthless Justice) and



Geordi (Whitethorn's Mr. La Forge). Geordi has the makings of a rock star. Rolex once again shows excellence in all she does.

Back at work, 2023 was HER year. In June she won another 5 point major at the German Shorthaired Pointer Club of Washington field trial. When we got to Kansas for the National Championships, she ran in the Open Championship, but didn't perform to her usual standard. We subsequently found out that she had a sore back and ear infection. After resting for 3 days and taking medication for the ear infection, she was back to her usual self when it was time to run in the Amateur Championship. She put in a big run, pointing 2 single birds and one small covey(4-6 birds) with a high tail and perfect manners.

I owe much to Trena Cardwell for all of her hard work in training, conditioning and shaping Rolex into the champion that she is. Thank you, Trena, for doing such a fantastic job!

As a breeder, I cannot be more proud of Rolex and her progeny and hope to move forward with this progress in developing the Gordon Setter field dog of tomorrow. In addition, Rolex is the best house (bed, couch) dog ever, as they all should be.

February—A Great Time to Evaluate Your Dog's Heart Health

Love is in the air during the month of February, and many dog owners find their "true love" in a canine companion, warming their laps and their hearts. To help keep those hearts happy and healthy, dogs and humans alike benefit from a daily walk or play time in the yard. However, there are many factors that can affect heart health.



Heart Health Can Start with Genetics

Over the years, reputable breeders have continued tracking the heart health of their dogs over generations to help minimize congenital abnormalities in future litters. Many AKC breed parent clubs have recommended echocardiograms (non-invasive ultrasound of the heart), specifically for canines in breeding programs.

Whippet breeder Gail Boyd, a board member of the American Whippet Club (AWC), explains: "Every Whippet, prior to breeding, should have breed-specific health testing performed. For Whippets, that includes CAER (eyes) clearance, BAER (hearing) testing, and Advanced Cardiac Clearance by a board-certified veterinary cardiologist. The AWC's Whippet Health Foundation recommends a minimum of testing every two years (cardiac), although select breeders test dogs annually, especially between 5 to 9 years of age. Armed with the knowledge of the initial onset of cardiac changes allow breeders an opportunity to make wise choices in their breeding program."

Large and giant breeds, like the Doberman Pinschers or Great Danes, can have higher rates of heart disease. There are, however, several smaller breeds that are closely watched as well, such as the Cavalier King Charles Spaniel, Dachshund, and Miniature Poodle. Regardless of the breed, each parent club publishes health test recommendations for breeders.

Veterinary Cardiologists

Often, cardiac issues are diagnosed early by a veterinarian and then are referred to a veterinarian cardiac specialist, who has advanced training in the heart and circulatory systems. A cardiac specialist uses diagnostic tools, such as an echocardiogram, electrocardiogram (ECG), or radiographs.

Cardiac issues include, but are not limited to:

- Congenital abnormalities of the heart (present at birth).
- Age-related degenerative heart disease, such as mitral value disease. This is the most common degenerative heart disease (75% of canine heart disease).
- Heart muscle disease (dilated cardiomyopathy and hypertrophic cardiomyopathy).
- Congestive heart failure.

Diet and Exercise

Like people, it's important for our canine friends to have a balanced, nutritional diet. Table scraps are tasty for Fido but aren't the healthiest for dogs. Human food often has excessive sodium, fats, or other ingredients that are harmful to them. Ask your veterinarian for the best diet plan to maintain healthy weight, blood pressure and heart for your dogs.

Keeping your dog active is a great way to keep weight in check, a healthy heart, and a strong body. Veterinarian Dr. Alise Baer of Carolina Ranch Animal Hospital says: "It's important to keep your dog fit and at a healthy weight. It's also important to feed a balanced diet, give them healthy exercise based on their abilities and weight, while also monitoring humidity and heat."

A dog's exercise regimen can change over time to fit with a senior lifestyle. A five-mile hike for a 3-year old dog may later in life be replaced with a half-mile walk and a gentle swim. Annual veterinarian check-ups are recommended to keep track of your dog's heart and what type of exercise is best.

Dental Health Is Connected to Heart Health

Keeping your dog's teeth and gums healthy can help prevent heart disease. The bacteria found in mouths of dogs is often the same as bacteria that causes endocarditis (inflammation/infection of the heart's interior). Providing dental chews, regular teeth brushing (using toothpaste that's safe for dogs), dental wipes, and dental water additives can assist in managing bacteria and plaque. Schedule regular vet visits to examine teeth and for dental cleanings.

Heartworm Prevention

Dogs can easily avoid heartworms, a potentially deadly parasite transmitted by mosquitos, by taking a preventative year-round. Individuals with much colder climates sometimes skip a month or two of heartworm preventatives in the winter, assuming that when the mosquitos are not present, the heartworm threat doesn't exist. However, heartworm prevention medicine kills parasites picked up from the previous month or two (opposite of flea and tick preventatives). It is recommended that heartworm prevention is provided year-round to ensure a heartworm-free dog. \P
